Donor Privacy Policy and Procedures

POLICY

1. Nevada Childhood Cancer Foundation's Donor Privacy Policy governs personal information entered on internet site (www.nvccf.org) in addition to the information that is sent to NVCCF through mail, communicated by phone, facsimile, email transmissions, or physically collected by staff.
2. Donor information is kept confidential. Donor information is not shared, exchanged, or sold. NVCCF will not share or sell a donor's personal information with anyone else, nor send donor mailings on behalf of other organizations.
3. NVCCF's commitment is to secure all information that is given or transferred to the foundation. Physical, electronic, and managerial procedures have been employed to safeguard the security and integrity of a donor's personal information.
4. Nevada Childhood Cancer Foundation collects donor's personal information online, including names, postal and e-mail addresses, phone and facsimile numbers, and billing information. NVCCF also collects business information from sole proprietorships that donate or request to receive information from the foundation. This information may include personal information, as well as personal information from individuals acting solely in their business capacity.
5. Unless otherwise requested, NVCCF will use a donor's personal information only for the purpose for which it is submitted, such as to reply to emails, process donation and business requests related to foundation events and programming, and to provide updates and foundation notices of events and important news. The foundation will not publish, loan, rent or sell a donor's personal or business information provided or collected. Donors may request this information may be added, updated, or removed from Nevada Childhood Cancer Foundation listings by contacting NVCCF at info@nvccf.org or by calling 702.735.8434.
6. The Foundation may release personal information under the following circumstances where (1) release is required by law (for example, a subpoena) or regulation or is requested by a government agency, (2) where NVCCF's records indicate a company may be engaged in fraudulent activity or other deceptive practices that a governmental agency should be made aware, or (3) to appropriate persons, where communication suggests possible harm to others.
